## SECONDS AND FOURTHS CONTINUE THEIR GREAT FORM

**A**fter the completion of Round Four, both the Second Eleven and the Fourths remain undefeated in their respective grades. The Seconds, in particular, have swept all before them, and look headed for a finals berth even at this early stage of the season. The Fourth Eleven have yet to field a settled side and although they face some tougher opponents in the weeks to come, their three victories and a draw have given them some valuable early points.

The First Eleven, despite a win in the opening game, have since failed to convert their winning opportunities into victories. The ruckus in the last game did not help, although some encouraging form was shown by the top order batsmen. With reigning Ward Medallist, Martin Reid, to come back into the team, and some players pushing for selection from the Seconds, captain Sean Carroll will be anxious to go into the Christmas break with more than six points on the board.

Dirk Barrow's side face a tougher draw later in the season, but with Dean Slade showing real potential with the bat and a range of bowlers to call upon, quite a few more victories are in store. It will be up to other teams to dislodge them from the top spot.

In the Thirds, not enough players are showing consistent form with the bat, and certainly some bigger scores are required if the team is to remain competitive in their grade. On the positive side, vice-captain Greg Snape has once again proven his worth as an all-rounder, while Johnny Lathleiff has made the step up to senior ranks with aplomb.

David Snape can do no wrong with the bat in the Fourth Eleven, and the bowlers are giving him great support as they maintain their unbeaten run from last season.

Meanwhile, the Fifts have suffered two embarrassing losses in recent rounds, with centuries to three opposition batsmen setting up scores that were out of the range of Ron Fauvel's team. A win before Christmas will help to restore some pride in their performance.

Our three Junior teams are all currently anchored on one win and two losses. Hopefully, these records should improve as the benefits of a full team being fielded every week are realized. It was also very pleasing to see two of our Junior captains, Paul Slade and Cameron Pinto, take part in recent representative games. Congratulations to the boys on their efforts.

**STOP PRESS** : On Tuesday night three CSCC First Eleven players were suspended by the CMCA tribunal for abusive language in Round Four.

# MINUTES

## COMMITTEE MEETING No. 5. 12 October 1995.

Held at the clubrooms. The meeting opened at 7.07pm. Present : R.Fauvel (chair), N.Barrow, P.Booth, D.Barrow, P.May, T.Gallagher, D.Jansen and R.Hess (minutes). L.Campbell arrived late. S.Carroll was absent.

**5.1 Minutes :** a) The minutes of the second meeting and the previous meeting were distributed. The minutes of the Annual Meeting were not yet available. b) Selected outstanding items on the Action List were discussed in General Business.

**5.2 Administrative Report :** a) Correspondence in included letters from Lifetime Trophies and other businesses, Knights, and the CMCA. It was agreed that a payment should be given to Knights as soon as possible (**ACTION : LC**). b) Letters were sent to all players that had not attended practice, and to all junior players. A cheque for \$875.00 had also been sent the CMCA. c) Marcus Price and Tuan Le had been registered.

**5.3 CMCA Delegate's Report :** a) At the meeting on 4 October 1995, it was confirmed that : The club would be fielding three junior teams ; Umpires must be paid before the match commenced ; No date had been set for the CMCA Presentation Night.

**5.4 Junior Report :** a) It was noted that the Under 14s and Under 16s still needed players, while the Under 12s had a surplus. b) A number of subscriptions had been collected and several caps had been sold. c) It was agreed that junior committee meeting minutes would be forwarded to all committee members (**ACTION : DB**).

### **5.5 Koornang And Lord Park Trust Report :**

a) The Annual Meeting would be held on 23 October 1995.

### **5.6 Duncan MacKinnon Park COM Report :**

a) The Annual Meeting was the next scheduled meeting. It was agreed that the matter of securing long term tenancy of a second ground should be followed up (**ACTION : DJ**).

**5.7 Financial Report :** a) A cash flow budget and a reimbursement sheet were tabled and the Treasures answered queries concerning these documents. b) It was estimated that current receipts over expenditure was \$1300.

**5.8 General Business :** a) In reference to 1994/95 item 9.8d, it was agreed that larger bins were needed for the clubrooms as soon as possible (**ACTION : DJ**). In reference to 1994/95 item 13.5 h, it was agreed that a security locker would be provided and installed as soon as possible (**ACTION : PB**). c) It was agreed that second and subsequent year gold pass members would receive a free item of club apparel. d) New cricket shirts were to be ordered as soon as possible, including long sleeves and large sizes (**ACTION : DB & RH**). e) Caps were also to be ordered as soon as possible (**ACTION : DB & RH**). f) After discussion it was agreed that the submission of press and match reports would not be 'centralized', although fines would be closely monitored. g) All captains were to be notified regarding the addition of no-balls to bowling figures (**ACTION : DB**). h) D.Barrow asked that his disapproval of a particular training drill be noted. i) It was noted that one day games would commence at 12.30pm and consist of eighty-four overs. j) It was requested that all members of the committee should ensure that match balls are deposited in the clubrooms at the conclusion of each game. k) The proposed venue change for H Grade in Round Two was to be ignored. l) It was noted that changes of venues for games had to be approved by the CMCA Executive. m) N.Barrow had requested a set of keys for the clubrooms (**ACTION : RF**). n) It was noted that the donated bat had been sold to Andrew Miles for \$220. A downpayment of \$150 was

forthcoming, and the remainder was to be paid in a fortnight, otherwise the player could be deemed unfinancial. o) It was noted that T. Brain was classified as unfinancial in the first round and therefore did not play as there was an excess of players. p) A raffle was to be held after the next game, and committee members were to encourage players to attend. The possibility of individual teams being set fundraising targets was discussed as an option for the future. q) The disgraceful state of the clubrooms was once again discussed. It was agreed that the 'can crusher' should be repaired, larger bins should be purchased, and larger garbage bags procured (**ACTION : PB**). These actions notwithstanding, the attitudes and behaviour of members in respect to keeping the rooms tidy was very unsatisfactory. r) An annual payment of \$160 had been paid for insurance. s) It was envisaged that a junior roster for travel may need to be drawn up for the remainder of the season. t) It was noted that the soccer club had shared tenancy of the rooms until November. They had agreed to pay for the cost of steamcleaning the carpet, which would be arranged at our convenience (**ACTION : DB**). u) All outstanding perpetual club trophies were to be returned as soon as possible (**ACTION : TG**). v) It was noted that the television had been stolen. No arrangements had been made for its replacement. w) Articles were required for the November issue of *At The Crease*. x) Carnegie cricket club were to be informed on the morrow that they would need to provide their own matting and equipment this season (**ACTION : RF**). y) The possibility of procuring a stretcher or cart to carry the mats on wet days in particular was raised as a possibility for future action. z) Paul May was thanked for his donation of 'Champion' paper.

The meeting closed at 8.27pm. Next meeting to be held at the clubrooms on 9 November 1995 at 7.30pm.
