President's Report

Excellent Season!! Two Flags!!

In re-capping the season that was the Club fielded five senior sides in the 2009/10 season for the first time in many years, with two sides (our Thirds and Fourths) winning the Grade Final in E & G Grades. This is a fantastic achievement when you take into account that the Thirds and Fourths were promoted to these grades this season. These two premierships highlight the depth of talent at the club.

The First XI had a tough year with results not falling their way in a couple of close games. The Firsts struggled to bat out the 72 overs and left most of the work to its respected bowling line up but it's tough to generate a win in the Longmuir Shield comp on bowling and fielding alone. Next season we will be looking for some batsmen to lead the way in the Ones and to provide a score for the bowlers to defend.

Several promising younger players emerged from all grades and the Club's junior program is producing some great performances at Senior level.

The remaining Senior 2nd and 5th elevens had extremely good seasons and just missed out by the barest of percentage to play finals – with the Seconds missing out by just 0.03% (basically one wicket or a 20 or so runs).

In season 2009-10 the Club fielded teams in the under 14 and under 16 competitions with varying levels of success. Unfortunately we had to withdraw our under 12 team as most of these players transitioned to the Under 14s, and we were unable to secure enough players to make a full team. This was a substantial blow to our junior program and this reverberates up through the teams (including Senior teams), especially when we are represented in Longmuir Shield.

The Club has placed an enormous emphasis on developing the best possible junior program for next season and will work hard during the winter to ensure this is put in place. The club will re focus on building the three junior teams and will invest both time and money to make sure this occurs.

The Club has also run a successful "Milo Have A Go" program on Friday nights at Lord Reserve over the past few years. This is a fantastic concept and the continued growth of this program is providing us with a strong base to build our Junior program in years to come.

I'd like to thanks all members of the committee, junior coaches, captains and supporters of Carnegie South for their support throughout the year. Without these people we wouldn't continue as a viable club. I encourage everyone to contribute next whether it is on the committee or in another role.

The Redback's Clubroom has been a great place to be all year. An excellent atmosphere at the club encourages people to hang around after training and games and breeds a culture of success on the field.

The club also made a separate donation to this club. We would also like to acknowledge Whittlesea Cricket Club, who generously decided to decline the prize and offer their half to Strathewen. All in all a fantastic day that I am sure will grow in the years to come.

Overall however the committee is quite pleased with the financials of the club and hopes to build on this success into future seasons.

First XI Summary

The First XI started the season in fine style with a win over last years finalist Elwood then butchered a close game against ANA by dropping catches and having 4 run outs in our innings.

A better all round performance saw us knock off local rivals Washington Park in round 3 which set up a real test for us against reigning premier East Sandringham in round 4. Kevin Pereira and Tristan Reith started well for us putting on 46 but the wheels fell off after that and we were dismissed for only 117 which they passed easily.

Again we hit back in the next game with the bat against Omega , Pereira making 74 against his favourite bowling attack , John Collison made 55 and 15 year old Tim Snape played beyond his years in making 30 not out. With the game seemingly under control on day 2 we dropped some crucial catches and Omega took advantage to defeat us in the 2nd last over.

Round 6 against Le Page and we were a disastrous 8-58 but Tim Snape stepped up again with 50 not out to get us up to 141. Once again the game went to the wire but we didn't quite have enough runs despite a superb spell from Scott Adams we lost by 2 wickets.

We travelled to the previously winless Kingston Heath for the last game before the break and once again lost a close game , making 150 chasing 172. A top order collapse had us in all sorts of trouble but a mature innings of 49 from the emerging Simon Kulikov nearly got us home.

We batted on a 'beach' at Bentlygh Uniting and could only manage 82 in nearly a whole day which they passed comfortably on day 2.

Back at home and bowling 1st we had Mackie 8-140 before they got away from us at the end and we could only manage 155 in reply.

Our best bowling performance for the season came in round 10 at Brighton Union , against a strong Union line-up we had them 8-90 and then had a clear run out given not out as the umpire was out of position and once again we couldn't finish off the opposition and they got 174 which proved way too many for us as another poor batting performance saw us rolled for 84.

West Bentlygh smashed us with the bat in the last game making 345 but we batted well in reply getting 259 with 50's from young opener Josh Fisher, John Collison and Scott Handley.

Too many batting collapses marred our season , we didn't bat 72 overs in any game, and until we do we can't hope to compete.

On a positive note, young guys such as Simon Kulikov, Tim Snape and Josh Fisher all improved and will be good bats for the club.

Our bowling stood up well with Scott Handley and Glenn Gallagher again bowling well along with youngsters Scott Adams , Sam Florence and Nick Hulston who all took big step forwards with the ball.

Despite our lowly ladder position we were very competitive in most games, we need a couple of experienced batsmen to bat with our young guys and I think we can be in a position to play finals next season.

Second XI Summary

Coming off the back of a finals appearance in Quiney Shield last season the second eleven were looking forward to 2009/10 with a genuine belief that we could improve on what was achieved last year. With a new skipper Chris "Macdog" MacDonald taking the reins, a serious amount of talented guys pushing up from the thirds, and a core group of gun players the feeling was pretty good among the group.

What has been the two's biggest downfall in recent years is our slow starts to the season forcing us to play catch from then on in , and we were keen to put to bed this problem. Unfortunately, we came out and once again took a while to settle into the season sitting at 1-2 after the first three rounds, with a poor loss to lowly Elwood to start the season (still their only win) and a crushing loss to Washington in round three, separated by a great performance against Southside in round two with a resounding 5 wicket win.

From there the boys regrouped to post three successive victories and get to 4-2.

The next two rounds proved our undoing as we played finals contender Kingston Heath and eventual premiers Chelsea Heights and came out with two losses. The shame was that in both games we were right in the contest and only missed out because of small patches of play where we dropped the intensity. I have no doubt that we could have beaten either team if we had our time again.

However, we did not let these results deter us and we re-focused on the last three rounds, with a couple of tough games coming up we had to be on song to claim a place in the finals. Round 9 saw us travel to Mackie who were sitting in 3rd at the time. We batted first and got off to a great start with Ady and Blocky putting on 79, both making 40's, however, debutant Will Nash was the only one to get going in the middle order scoring a fighting 27, until big Jimmy came to the crease with the innings precariously placed at 6/157. He was surprisingly watchful and patient early on, waiting for the bad ball to dispose until he got his eye in and the fireworks started. Jimmy blasted every bowler that tried their luck with fours and sixes nearly every ball, and finished on a massive 82* to boost the score to 289 by the end of our innings. His hitting earned us over 60 runs in the last 5 overs.

We knew it would be tough against a strong batting line up and with the Mackie boys on top young Nashy was thrown the ball and responded immediately with the breakthrough wicket, then another one a few balls later. Joel returned to pick up rampaging T-Krot and finished with three as did Mick H. In the end we won easily by 70 runs.

Round 10 was by far our best performance. We set out a specific game plan - to win outright. Sounded simple enough. We had a bowl on day one and after 25 minutes had Chelt Park reeling at 6/10!! A mini fight back was staged but in 26 overs we had routed them for 77. Mick H picking up 5 and Joelly 4. Speedos opened up with Nashy and consequently "threw his wicket away for the good of the team" making a duck. This brought Carl Schleiger to the crease back in the twos for the first time all year. He came out from the dark shadows cast by his brother to slash and pull his way to an entertaining 49 which took us past Chelt Park for a first innings lead, Nashy batted well again for 45 and Grechy chipped in with 22* at the end. After 25 overs we had cruised to 6/145, and decided to put them in again for another 10 overs before the close of an eventful day one. This yielded another couple of wickets and gave us a big chance of the elusive 10 points. Day two saw Chelt Park fight some more and eventually rattle up 111, with Joelly claiming 4, and Raj and Dom 2 important wickets each in the middle. Our target of 46 was achieved one down with Nashy leading the way again on 23* including consecutive sixes to get off the mark. Dave Snape picked up maximum votes for his dominant display against Solid from Chelt Park. Outright win: Tick!

Round 11 saw us travel to Victory Park to take on West Benteigh with a win and some favorable results seeing us into the finals for consecutive years. We bowled and got on top early with Micky and Joely picking up 4 early ones between them until Westers provided some middle order resistance and looked like posting a score in excess of 200 before the man Raj stepped in and got the breakthrough, from there we rolled through them to dismiss them for 178, not a bad score on a slow ground. Our best were Joel grabbing 3 and Micky 4 wickets.

Our batting innings started strongly with Aids and The Shadow (Polly) scoring briskly until Aids fell for a quick 22, Nashy came in at 3 and was rock solid supporting Polly who got to 37, and then MacDog who made 23. However after being 3/113 the innings hit a snag falling to 6/127 after Nashy departed for possibly the slowest

21 ever made, and then to 8/148 after Jimmy hit a few of boundaries to keep the score ticking in a brief stay. This meant we had the man Raj and Domma out there, both with limited match batting practice. As the required rate “soared” to over 3 (ask Joelly about that) the boys knuckled down and once they had their eyes in got right on top of the bowling, edging us closer to victory, until we passed their score with a boundary from Raj as he finished unbeaten on 23, Dom also not out on 19 including some pressure relieving boundaries.

A great win to see us finish on 6 normal wins and an outright win by season’s end. That meant we had collected 46 points- a total that would normally win a finals berth (we made finals with 42 points last year). However, this year we were unlucky to miss out by the smallest of percentages. I’m sure with the brand of cricket we were playing after Christmas many of the guys would have felt we could have done some damage in the finals, and we certainly could have which makes our final position that bit more disappointing. As usual our start to the season has been our downfall.

There are a lot of positives however with some great individual performances putting the team in match winning positions. Tim Snape started beautifully before being drafted in to the one’s team on the back of a well made 62 in round 4. After starting the season in the thirds Josh Fisher came into the team and played beautifully registering a ton (107*) against Omega in round 5, as well as two 40’s, he too got his well deserved chance in the one’s. Liam Grech also came into the team and put up some great performances with both bat and ball. Will Nash only played three seconds games yet made over 100 runs and took some important wickets.

Luke Adams and Chris MacDonald both registered half centuries in the opening two rounds and since then Micky H and Jimmy Convery have also posted important 50’s in the middle order when chasing. Jimmy also posted the brutal 82* against Mackie.

The bowlers improved with each game and are recording some impressive figures, with Joelly & Mick H each picking up two bags of 5, and had 56 wickets between them for the season, and Dom Cerreto with his match winning haul of 7 wickets a team high. However, we cannot forget Raj “Mr. Cricket” Lokuge spinning Elwood into a web and picking up 5 wickets in a typically energetic performance from the livewire.

We have also been graced with the presence of some of E grades finest with Rudi playing the one game for a lazy 88 runs and 2 wickets with the ball in a 15 over spell that secured victory for us, we also had the luxury of Nutta hitting out down the order and dominating middle order batsman until he decided to “retire” to the three’s. Hopefully his knee is feeling better.

The seconds even had Liam “P. Heart” Callery join the team for one week; unfortunately it was a two week game!

Special thanks to Bruce’s super sub, Mani, who gave us absolutely nothing with the ball or in the field.

This team is moving in the right direction and next season, with a well balanced team full of young guns and seasoned performers, we need to play dedicated and disciplined team cricket, if we do this we will challenge for the premiership.

It took a few rounds for us to get all parts of our game into shape, but when we finally did, we looked very strong. In fact we only lost one game after round 3 and that was to the team we'd eventually beat in the Grand Final.

Our batting was extremely strong for the entire season. During the entire season we were only bowled out once and that was in the 64th over. When we batted first we averaged 262, which gave us great confidence in the field, and we were comfortable chasing down totals too. The hardest part of the batting was explaining to those batting down the order (all of which could bat in the top 5) that we, in fact, legitimately batted to 11 and that everyone had a specific role to play in the team.

Our bowling was super strong too. When Nutter joined us in round 4, his impact was instant, as Nutter had the ability to shut down one end for 20 overs, which helped the bowlers at the other end to apply pressure and open up opportunities for wickets. What was even more amazing was that even though we played on some very small grounds, Nutter still had an economy rate of 2.02 runs per over whilst taking 23 wickets.

With Nutter bowling so tightly at one end I have no doubt that this helped Jacob Curtis perfect his line and length bowling and by second half of the year, Jacob's in-swing bowling was the perfect foil to Nutter's tight leggies. When we picked up Rudi Schleiger, we formed a very strong core bowling attack that proved to be too good for the opposition for most of the year. We also had plenty of change bowlers such as Will Nash, Trendy, Doyley, Speedy, Liam Callery and even the odd sniper over from the Doctor and this mix of options rotating throughout the year worked very well.

The hardest part for me in this strong team was trying to give everyone a decent chance to contribute to the team result, and in particular, give the younger group an opportunity to put their results on the board so that they could progress up to the Seconds.

As it was such a successful season for the Thirds, there were many highlights, but the two great achievements for the season that stood out for me on an individual level were

- Jacob Curtis' bowling. Jacob was outstanding in the latter half of the year in particular and I have no doubt that he will bowl in the higher grades from next year and should push himself for a spot in the Firsts bowling line up. Jacob's finals stats were unbelievable (46 overs, 20 maidens, 6 wickets, 1.87 runs per over, avg 14.3) and he truly stepped up when he needed to.
- Will Nash's mature batting. Will opened the batting for much of the season and has shown the talent and maturity to go all the way up the grades too. Will's foot work to spin and level headedness in the middle are major assets that give him a great foundation to build his batting on in the years to come.

There were many others, such as Speedy cementing himself as an opening batsman, Fluff always providing runs in any batting position, Nutter's spin bowling that I've mentioned, Doctor driving all the way from somewhere around Wilson's Prom every week and either making plenty of runs (5 Fiftys in 9 innings, 416 runs, avg 52) or taking a couple of bonus wickets and pumping everyone up in the field while leading from the front and Dobbys keeping like the young gun that he was every now and then!!

The bottom line was that we had an incredibly strong side and when we played to our potential, we were unbeatable and that's how it panned out in the end. It's one thing to have a team of talented and experienced

individuals but it's entirely another thing to work hard together and get winning results as a team and we proved that in the end without a shadow of a doubt.

Thanks guys, I'll remember this season as one of the greatest ones!!
