Coach's Report

Season 10-11 was an exciting time for the Redbacks but ultimately we failed to deliver on the goal of playing finals in any of our senior grades.

A big win over West Bentleigh in round 6 had us 3rd at Christmas but whatever we had for XMAS didn't work as our batting was terrible in the next 3 games when we were beaten badly.

A competitive effort against runner up Brighton Union and a comfortable win over finalist Elwood rounded out the season.

5 wins and 6 losses was the end result, our batting lacked the mental discipline required to make runs consistently and cost us a chance to play finals.

Our bowling and fielding generally stood up well but we need better application with the bat if we are to go deeper next year.

First XI Summary

Captains report

This time we batted first and things got off to a flyer with KP and Joshy fish making the most of things with Joshy making 50. With runs on the board we were in good spirits against the billionaires and with some top notch fielding we were right in it until the end, but with only 5 bats back in the shed and the opposition skip still out there, with a lot of luck on his side, we couldn't hold them and lost with 3 balls to spare. Farmer 3/45, Patch 2/34.

Round 5 saw Kingston Heath head to the web and once again the rain fell and a limited overs game was the result. With Kingston batting first we managed to make some nasty blunders in the field and saw them with some luck and got them to 9/127. Making the most of the sunshine we fell to 4/24 before too long and had our backs to the wall throughout the innings with no need to mention individuals. Ending the innings at 104 we looked 3-2 in the face knowing it should have been better.

The last round of the year and the Redbacks flew all the way to West Bentleigh to take on Choppers men. Having some unusual good weather on day one we batted first. With KP back to form and a dodgy pitch we managed a reasonable start but nothing spectacular. Enter Kuli and Farmer. A big partnership and some top batting saw the Redbacks notch 8/213 with Farmer 52*, Kuli 44, KP 39 and Noombie caressing a solid 29. With a big total and a windy day we looked good from the first ball with Patchy swinging the pill a pitch width and setting us up for a short afternoon with West Bentleigh bent over for 86. Farmer 5/17, Patch 3/26.



First game back we head to Hampton Central for one of our more brief encounters, batting first we looked a bit average and were bowled out by a 16 year old for 41. Without much to lose we had a crack and knocked off 3 but were done in little time with Noombie snatching 2/8.

Time for round 8 & we head to Bentleigh ANA, with yet another one dayer, this time due to a grand final replay, we field first on a hot day. With Rudi still out and some sore heads on the day we saw some controversy with joshy taking a catch in the trees & some easy chances put down. Chasing 155 we looked shaky early and with only a few little partnerships on the way we fell short at 90.

Next round and needing a win we headed to East Sandy BC and with a clear day we batted first and were once again facing a small total with wickets falling fast, without any notable mentions we ended at 88 and had East Sandy come out swinging looking to put runs up early, with Rudi off the short run up and Noombie swinging the ball around we had them 8/110 at their declaration. Batting again we got off to a bad start and just managed triple figures in another disappointing effort. East Sandy decided not to try the 79 runs in 7 overs.

Brighton Union were next at the web and once again playing a one day game due to plenty of rain, winning the toss and batting first we had some luck at the top order with Pommy fish throwing down 33 out of a total of 121. With our fielding caps on once again there was some great work around Lords no.2 and the before xmas urgency we missed so much. And yet again it was the opposition skipper getting them over the line with only 4 bats down.

Last round of the year and we lose our skip for the final show down against our mates Elwood. With Kuli again taking charge and Pommy fish remembering how to bat the boys put on a great show with 6/165 after the yet again limited overs. Pommy fish 88, Stewie 32. Happy with where we were wickets needed to fall, with tight bowling and held catches the Redbacks held Elwood to 7/162 to take the game. Rudi chiming in with a tidy 4/20.

Thanks to everyone that helped out during the year, thanks to Hoppy, Marg and Ara for their scoring efforts and a big thanks to coach Bruce for putting in as much effort as he does around CSCC. Second XI Summary

Captains report

The 2nds were looking for another big season in 2010/2011 with an eye on taking the next step and playing in finals for the first time in a couple of years. The season got off to a rocky start with the announcement that star all-rounder Michael Hulston would be unavailable for the majority of the season due to a long term injury. This gave opportunity to a number of young guns to step up take some extra responsibility.... and it didn't take long at all!

Round 1 saw us line up for the "Bruce Haley Cup" against Mackie, a team we've dominated for a number of years in the 2's. Our good form continued with stand out performances by Will "the rock" Nash (61) and Hughy "baby biceps" Nicholson (79) smashing us to a great win.

Rounds 2 & 3 saw us lose close games to arch rivals Washington Park and Le Page which was disappointing. Highlights included a superman like catch at 1st slip from Dave "chuck" Norris, a run out with a fingertip on the ball as it was smashed back past him from Sam "the human coathanger" Florence and another solid 25 from Nashy.

Kingston Heath were a threat that faced us in round 5 and we were desperate to get over the line against these guys. Before the game Adrian "the mouth from the south" Hulston had a master-stroke idea to open the bowling with big Liam Grech in an effort to surprise the batsman. It certainly did that as he actually bowled like a champion keeping runs to a minimum. Jacob and Sammy then took advantage & picked up 3 wickets each in a dominant bowling display by all bowlers. Needing 105 to win, Polly Schleiger & Ducky Norris teamed up for a solid 43 opening stand with big hitting Tristan Burgess smacking 36 in quick time to get us over the line only 1 wicket down. Great win!!

Being 3-2 we faced a strong West Bentleigh in round 6. Rubber man Rudy "Mr Baldy" Schleiger returned to the side and while expensive, took a handy 6 wickets. The luck didn't go our way on the day with several close calls turned down and excellent tight bowling from Manning (1/31 off 15 overs) and Florence (1/36 off 17 overs). Starts to Nash, Polly, Hughy and Dom "Pancake" Cerreto wasn't enough to get us over the line.

We drew a line in the sand for Hampton Central in round 7 and were not going to accept anything less than a victory. Another sensible knock by Nashy (69) and excellent support from Adrian (43) setup a great platform for Daniel "Boonga" Stumbles. Boonga hit an amazing 51 that included 10 x 4's and 1 x 6 - a truly magnificent innings! Having set Hampton 226 to win, disaster struck early when Joely when down with a shoulder injury. The rest of the boys had to stand up and first man to do it was Bling. Taking 3/28 of 8 overs took the pressure off and with solid cameo's from Nutta and Nashy, we secured another win.



Round 8 saw us play Melbourne Wanderers who were already in the top 4. A solid contribution by all bowlers restricted them to 161 which was very achievable. Hoping to close our the outright we battled away on week 2 but could only secure 4 wickets on day 2 to narrowly miss out on outright.

Finals weren't to be in 2010/2011 but the development of young guns Nashy, Jacob and Grechy was awesome to see. So many contributors (with both cricket skills and humour) throughout the season made the 2nds a great place to play cricket. I have every confidence in the boys to take the next step next year and I am extremely proud of all their efforts through the season.

A big thank you to Bruce Haley for his guidance and faith in the boys and all the assistance from the veterans that were always people I could turn to.

In the last game of the season, I decided we should have some fun as it had been a long season:

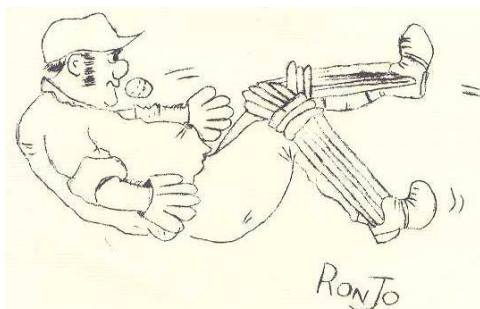
- The father and son combination of Hughy and Jimmy opened the batting – great to see

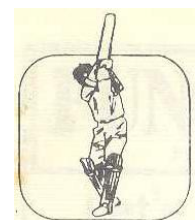
