

Technique #1 How to Crop an Image in PhotoShop

1. Go to **Google Images**
2. Search: **Barack Obama**
3. '**Right-click**' (hold down **Control**) to **Save Image** of this portrait to your **Flash Drive**



4. **Start PhotoShop**
5. **Open** saved image of Obama
6. Locate **CROP TOOL** on **tool box** and click



Note the **activation nodes** that appear around the image.

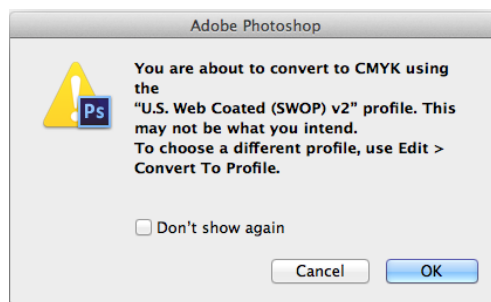
7. **Click and drag** to determine area to be cropped (preferably his head and shoulders)
8. Press **Return** (on your keyboard) to actually **crop** the image
9. View the cropped image. (Use **Command+Z** to Undo if necessary)
10. Use **File > Save As** to save the cropped image to your Flash Drive (Select **Maximum** image quality during Save As)



Technique #2 How to Convert an RGB Image to CMYK in PhotoShop

This technique should be used prior to inserting an image into a document that you intend to **print professionally**, that is, in a book, newspaper or magazine.

1. Keep the cropped image open (or re-open it)
2. Go to (top menu) **Image**
 - > **Mode**
 - > **CMYK Color**(Leave at 8 Bits/Channel)
3. A colour conversion notice appears: Click **OK**



4. Save a copy of this converted image, which is now suitable for **printing in full colour** – **Cyan Magenta Yellow K** (for **black**, the **Key** colour) – to your flash drive.

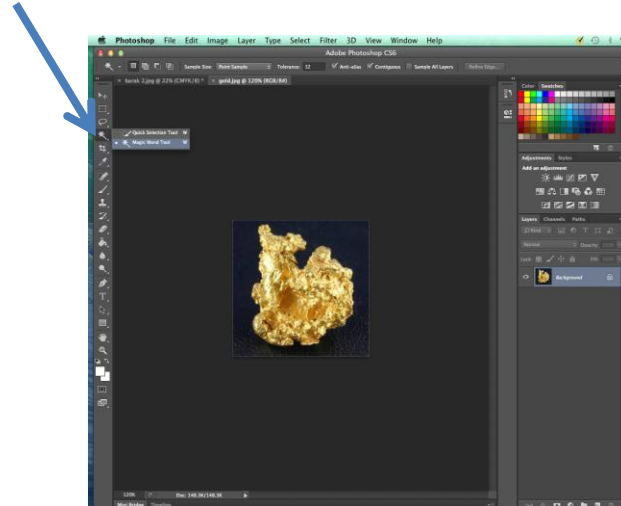
Technique #3 How to Contour (cut-out) Images with Highly Contrasting Colours

1. Go to **Google Images**
2. Search: **Gold Nugget**
3. '**Right-click**' (hold down **Control**) to **Save Image** of this nugget (with a contrasting background)



4. Start **PhotoShop**

5. Click on **Magic Wand** (you may need to **hold down** top option to reveal Magic Wand)



5. Click on **unwanted black area**
(use **Shift** to get all unwanted areas – ensure Tolerance is at about 32)

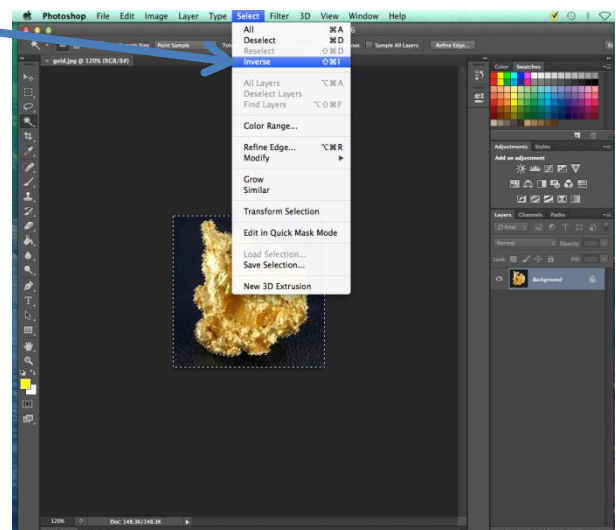
6. (Go to top menu) **Select > Inverse**

7. (Go to top menu)

Layer > New > Layer > OK

(make sure the Layers window is showing – via Windows)

8. You must **click** back to the **original (background) layer** to do next operation



9. (Go to top menu) **Edit > Copy** (from original layer)

10. Click on the **NEW** layer > **Paste** (via **Edit** menu)

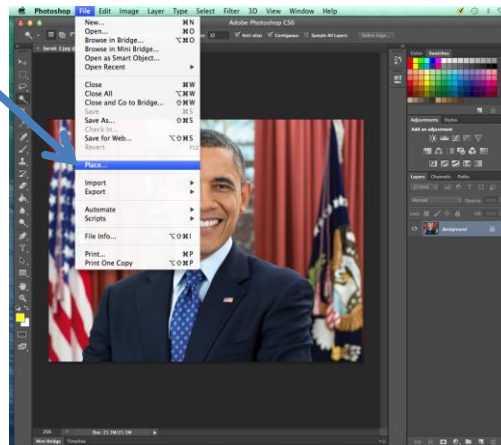
11. **Delete Old Layer (delete original): click on original layer and press Delete** (the image now appears without its background)



12. Then **Save As** a **TIFF** file (or **PSD**), **not** a **JPEG**, ensuring the options that appear during the save process are selected to suit Mac or Windows, as the case may be.

Technique #4 How to Place an Image on Another Photo using PhotoShop

1. **Open** your original image of Barack Obama
2. Go **File > Place**



3. Select the file and click on **Place**. (File appears on top of existing image.)



4. Use **activation nodes** to **resize** and **move** into position
5. When ready, press **Return** and image will be placed.



6. **Save** the file.
