# A SEASON FULL OF PROMISE

fter the club's very successful season in 1994/95, the new Committee has set itself some important targets. The key challenge will be to consolidate our on-field success as a number of teams move up the grades.

To this end, Sean Carroll has once again been appointed First Eleven captain/coach, with Noel Barrow as vice captain and Tim Gallagher as deputy vice captain. After a well deserved flag in 'C Grade', their aim will

be to maintain their momentum and try for a spot in the finals of a higher grade. The Second Eleven, on the other hand, under the leadership of new captain Dirk Barrow, will not be satisfied with anything less than the ultimate prize after a disappointing finals series last March. The Third Eleven has also undergone a change of

leadership, and Dave Jansen and Greg Snape will be looking for a more committed effort that makes them a more competitive unit in their grade. The Fourths, under the successful flagwinning combination of David Snape and Paul Booth, will not be allowed to cruise after being promoted up the ranks, and early wins will be a priority in order to establish their credibility against new opponents. The Fifth Eleven, promoted despite only moderate success, will benefit from the return of Premiership captain Ron Fauvel, and will also be anxious to score some early wins in a different grade.

But on-field performances are not the only challenge the club faces. A sound financial base needs to be achieved so that the club can avoid living a precarious hand-to-mouth existence.

All major debts have now been cleared thanks in no small part to the astute financial management of the Treasurer. Now the task is raise our financial capabilities in order to bring about improvements to the clubrooms, making them more attractive to players, supporters and opposition clubs. A first step in this process will

be to up-grade the unduly neglected honourboards, and to ensure that all team photographs are repaired and appropriately displayed. The Committee will also be meeting soon to draft the long awaited 'Five Year Plan', as they seek to establish important goals for this season and beyond.


#### ROUND ONE IN SEASON 1995/96


#### ROUND ONE IN SEASON 1995/96

#### MINUTES

#### COMMITTEE MEETING No. 3.

7 September 1995.

Held at the business premises of the Jansen family. The meeting opened at 7.20pm. Present : P.May (chair), N.Barrow, T.Gallagher, D.Jansen, P.Booth, L.Campbell, D.Barrow, S.Carroll (exofficio) and R.Hess (minutes). An apology was received from R.Fauvel.

- 3.1 Minutes: a) The minutes of the first meeting were distributed. The minutes of the Annual Meeting and the second meeting were not yet available. b) Outstanding items on the Action List were not discussed. c) Matters arising from the minutes were as follows: 1.3b) The Treasurer had negotiated the timing of club payments to the CMCA: 1.2c) The new postal address for the club was P.O.Box 263 Glenhuntly 3163: 15.5c) Details of the arrangements with Phillip Murphy were still to be confirmed (ACTION: RF): 1.5f) The availability of the rooms for the Grand Final Day function had been confirmed.
- 3.2 Administrative Report: a) All players except P.Cowan, S.Dobson and P.Booth had received notification of forthcoming practices. b) Letters had also been sent to captaincy applicants and all junior players. c) Correspondence had been received regarding future CMCA meetings, and confirming the use of Murrumbeena Park. A letter regarding the public liability of the club was also received (ACTION PM/LC). d) It was believed that M.Meredith had requested a meeting with the Committee but he was unable to be contacted for the present meeting. It was agreed that he should be notified re the date of the next meeting (ACTION: SC). e) Since the CMCA had deleted all non-current players from their registration list, it was agreed that all Committee members should receive an updated list and that the status of players requiring clearances should be clarified by the CMCA (ACTION: DB). f) P.Fenton had been granted a clearance to Washington Park, although the Secretary was reminded that all only financial players were eligible for clearances to other clubs.
- 3.3 Financial Report: a) In the absence of a formal budget, the Treasurer presented some approximate figures for the forthcoming season. Details outlining the expected net profit would be presented at the next meeting (ACTION: LC). b) It was anticipated that there would be one junior fundraiser which would also involve senior players. c) A request that the practice of distributing cricket shirts to new junior players be continued was to be considered by the junior committee.
- <u>3.4 Captaincy Appointments</u>: a) The appointment of T.Barry as Third Eleven vice-captain was doubtful and other applicants needed to be considered (ACTION:DJ). b) The appointment of the Fifth Eleven vice-captain was still to be confirmed.
- <u>3.5 General Business</u>: a) D.Jansen agreed to be the DMPCOM delegate. b) In reference to the Third Eleven pitch, it was suggested by D.Jansen that the pitch be moved 5 metres southward and 3 metres westward. The Secretary was to write a letter to the Council and the Trust regarding this recommendation as soon as possible (*ACTION: DB*). c) The matter of white club shirts was discussed at length. It was agreed that the Secretary would draft a

letter to advise all players that white tops were compulsory for all training sessions. d) Skipping ropes were to be purchased by S.Carroll and the cost was to be reimbursed by the Treasurer (ACTION: LC). e) A stocktake of all club apparel, including caps, was to take place so that new stock could be ordered as soon as possible (ACTION: DB/RH). f) A social calendar was to be compiled and published as soon as possible. Major events would include the Grand Final Day function, Trivia Night, Christmas Break-up, and Ward Medal night (ACTION: TG). g) The price of leather jackets was to be advised (ACTION: RF). h) It was agreed that all Committee members should be prepared to respond to the Paul May document [The X Files] at the next meeting (ACTION: ALL). i) It was also agreed that the Committee should instigate a vigorous policy of collecting subscriptions in order to alleviate any undue pressure on the Selection Committee. j) Career statistics for At The Crease had yet to be completed by Stuart Warren (ACTION: RH). k) The feasibility of raffling (or selling) the cricket bat was once again discussed, and it was agreed that the possibility of staging an auction as a social event should be investigated (ACTION: SC). 1) The Secretary requested that all blue CMCA folders be returned as soon as possible (ACTION: ALL ). m) Arrangements for the pennant unfurlings would be discused at the next meeting (ACTION: ALL). n) The Secretary advised that clarification would be sought regarding acceptable methods of recording noballs (ACTION: DB). o) The Treasurer advised that he would be seeking donations to offset the cost of updating the honourboards (ACTION: LC).

The meeting closed at 8.34pm. D.Jansen was thanked for his hospitality. The time and date of the next meeting would be advised.



# - HALL OF FAME -'C Grade' PREMIERS 1994/95


